She is currently under commission at South Coast Repertory and is a proud member of EST Youngblood and the Clubbed Thumb Early Career Writers Group 24/25. An upcoming production of *Poor Queenie* is scheduled for 2025 at Subtext Studio in Chicago. B.F.A. from NYU Tisch, Dramatic Writing.
